	Stephen Robinson presented images of the proposed design for the structured parking to be built in the Wilson Street parking lot. The Committee discussed their concerns regarding impacts to the adjacent protected heritage property (1 Carden Street) as well as suitable exterior materials for the structure. HG members expressed that concept drawings depicting streetscape models from seveal vantage points would be helpful.

Jeff presented an aerial image and identified how the owner would like to sever the property to create a new building lot and explained that there was no expectation of negative impact to the protected heritage building at 221 Woolwich Street. Stephen Robinson had conducted a site visit recently and reviewed motions from previous meetings regarding this property. Prior to the Committee of Adjustment making a decision, staff will be required to put forward a report to Council recommending that the description of the real property to protected by the heritage designation bylaw be amended to reflect the proposed severance.
